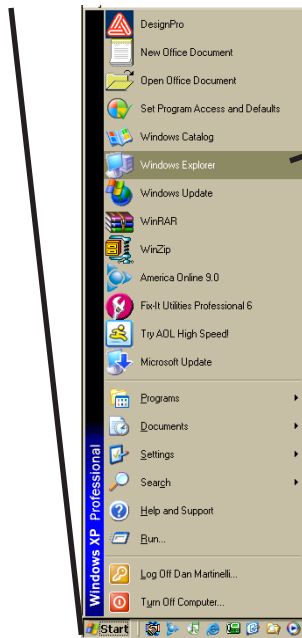

Quick Start Guide

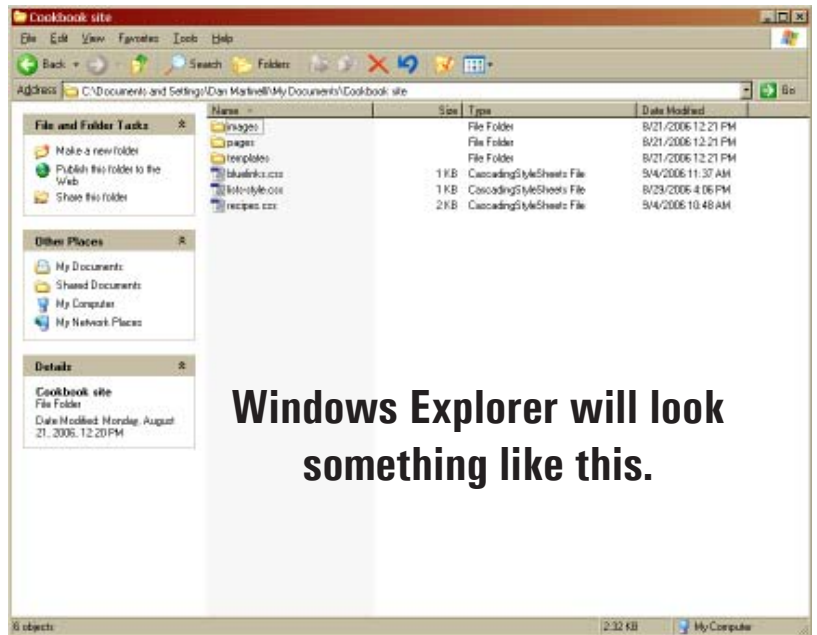
Your Treasury of Wild Recipes comes as a self extracting installation file. Whether you download the file or obtain it on a CD-ROM, installation is the same.

Open Windows Explorer by clicking **START** and then **WINDOWS EXPLORER** or **MY COMPUTER**.

Click on **START**



then Windows Explorer



Windows Explorer will look something like this.

Navigate to the Cook*.exe file on the CD-ROM or your download folder using Windows Explorer. Double click the Cook*.exe file to begin installation. An installation wizard will guide you through the installation process.

When installation is complete, you may immediately open the Cookbook by checking the “Open Cookbook now?” button. Installation will also place a shortcut to the Cookbook on your desktop, and a shortcut in your Start=> Programs folder. Use these to open your Cookbook. Installation will also add an Uninstall option. Use this should you wish to remove the Cookbook from your computer.

AOL USERS NOTE:

Cookbook LE displays in a 'browser' - in Windows systems, this is Internet Explorer. However, typical AOL installation sets the default browser to AOL instead. This means that your AOL software may open when you open the Cookbook. This is perfectly OK- but your Cookbook will be surrounded by your AOL window. It is NOT necessary to 'sign-on' to the AOL service to use the Cookbook. You WILL need to sign-on to visit any links in the Cookbook labeled "Internet connection required".

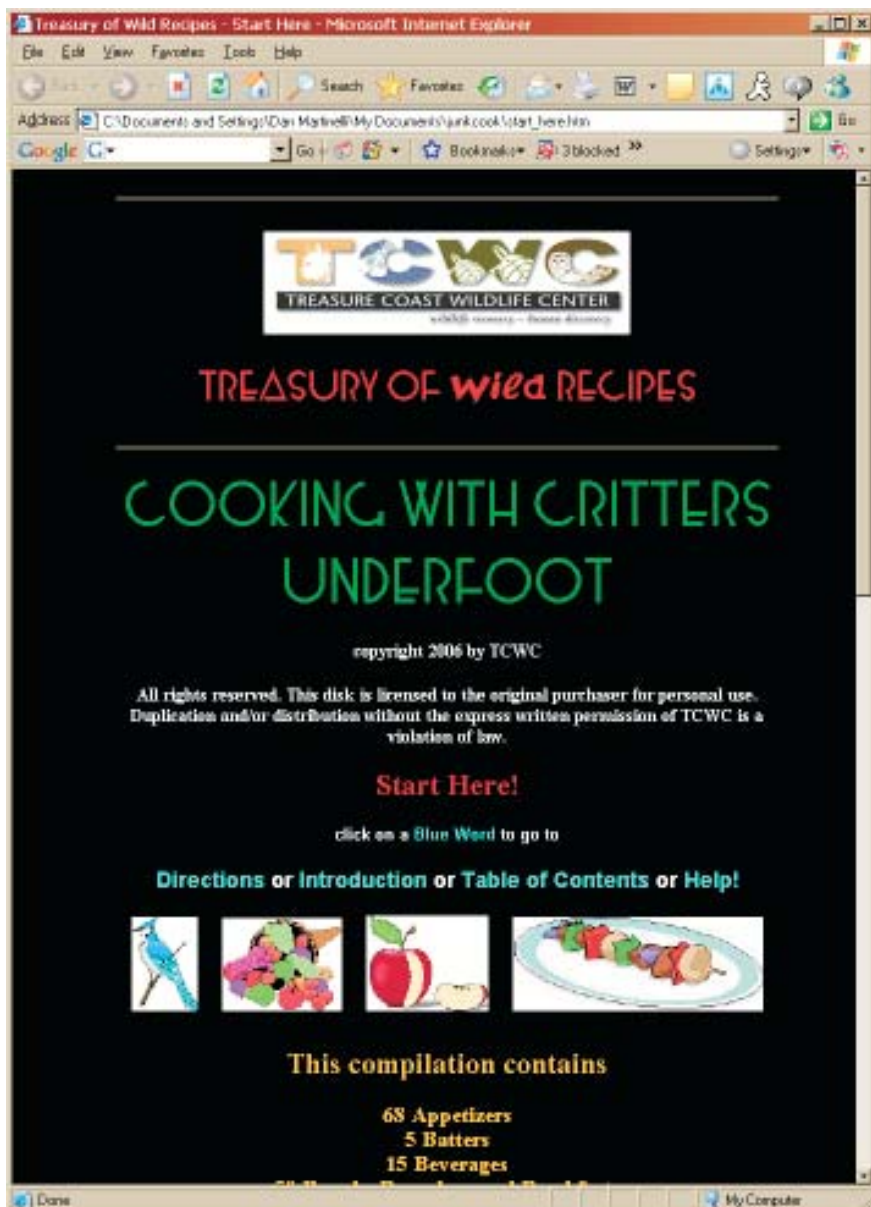
If you are comfortable with the AOL window, there is no need to change anything. But if you wish, you may change your default browser from AOL to Internet Explorer in START=> SETTINGS=> CONTROL PANEL=> Internet Options. If you do this, the Cookbook will open in a standard Internet Explorer window without opening the AOL software.

General Directions

We hope you will enjoy using this electronic 'book'. In organizing it, we tried to consider how we ourselves would use a paper recipe book. Of course, a 'browser' (the way you are viewing this e-book, for example with Internet Explorer) works differently from a paper book. But we have tried to enhance the similarities, for comfort's sake.

We might simply flip through the pages of a paper book, looking for exciting entries. Or we might examine the index, perhaps for a general category of dishes or with a mind to items at hand in the pantry. Finally, we might like to print a specific recipe, to carry to the kitchen or to share with a friend. All of these things can be done in this e-book.


Screen shot - Opening View



The Table of Contents is your starting - and your returning - point. It gives you full control of the Cookbook.

In the Table of Contents, recipes are organized into Chapters like Main Dishes, Desserts, and Vegetarian. You access these Chapters by clicking the appropriate [Recipes](#) link. Once in a Chapter, you can scroll up and down to see all of its recipes, just like flipping the pages in a book. And then you return to the Table of Contents by clicking your browser's BACK button.

Alternatively, you can open the Index of any Chapter from the Table of Contents by clicking the [List](#) link. You will see a listing of all the recipes in that Chapter. Click on any recipe name and you will be taken to that recipe in a Chapter. Your browser's BACK button will return you to the [List](#).

Each recipe name in a Chapter has a  button. Clicking this button will open a new browser window with a printer-friendly copy of the recipe. Use the browser's FILE => PRINT facility or its PRINT button to send the recipe to your attached printer. Then close the browser window.

Included are additional materials that we hope you will explore and enjoy, such as the history of this book, the organization that produced it, and some of our special Wild Friends.

We have also provided separate 'Navigation Links' to the Table of Contents throughout the Cookbook, from which all else can be accessed. *ENJOY!!*

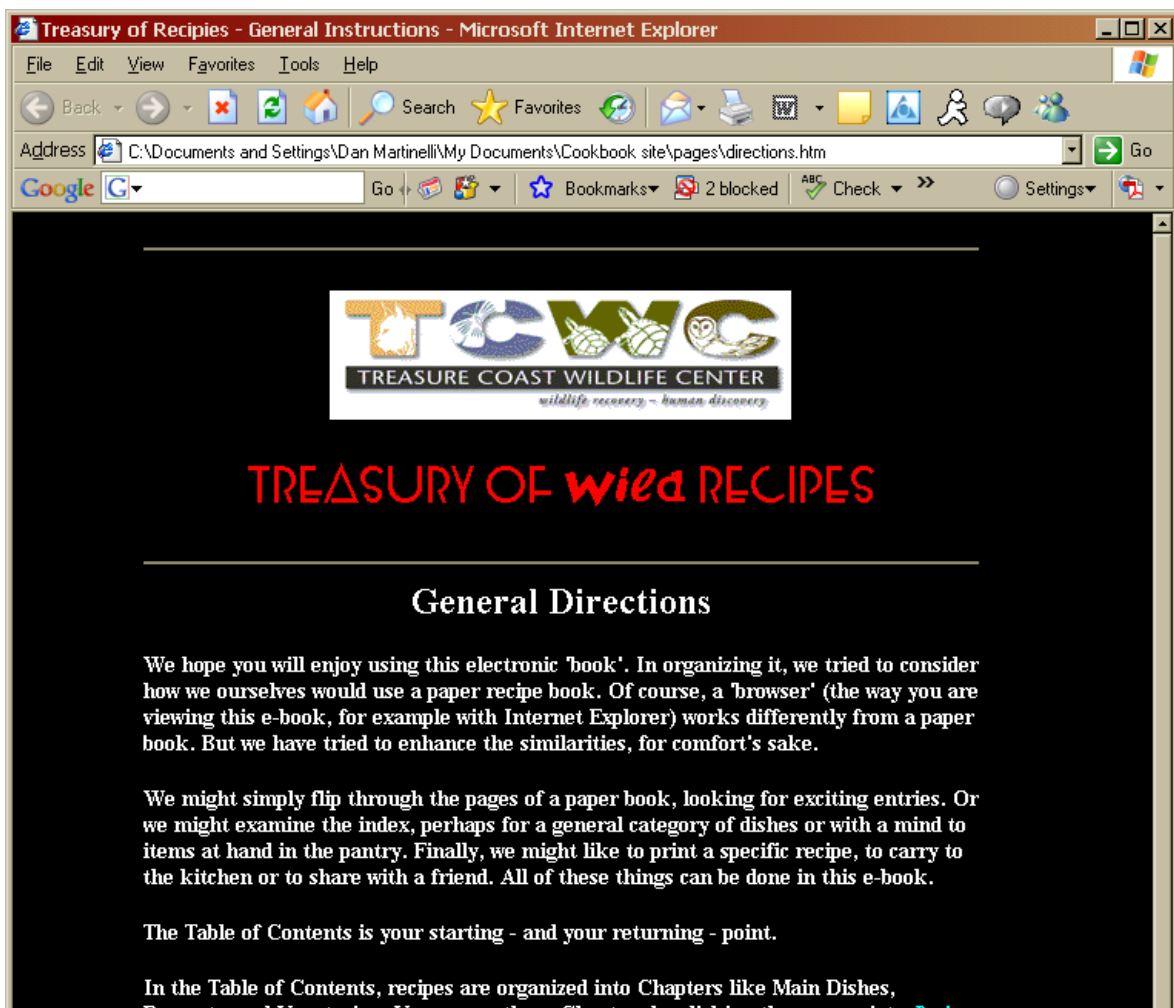

Screen shot - General Directions

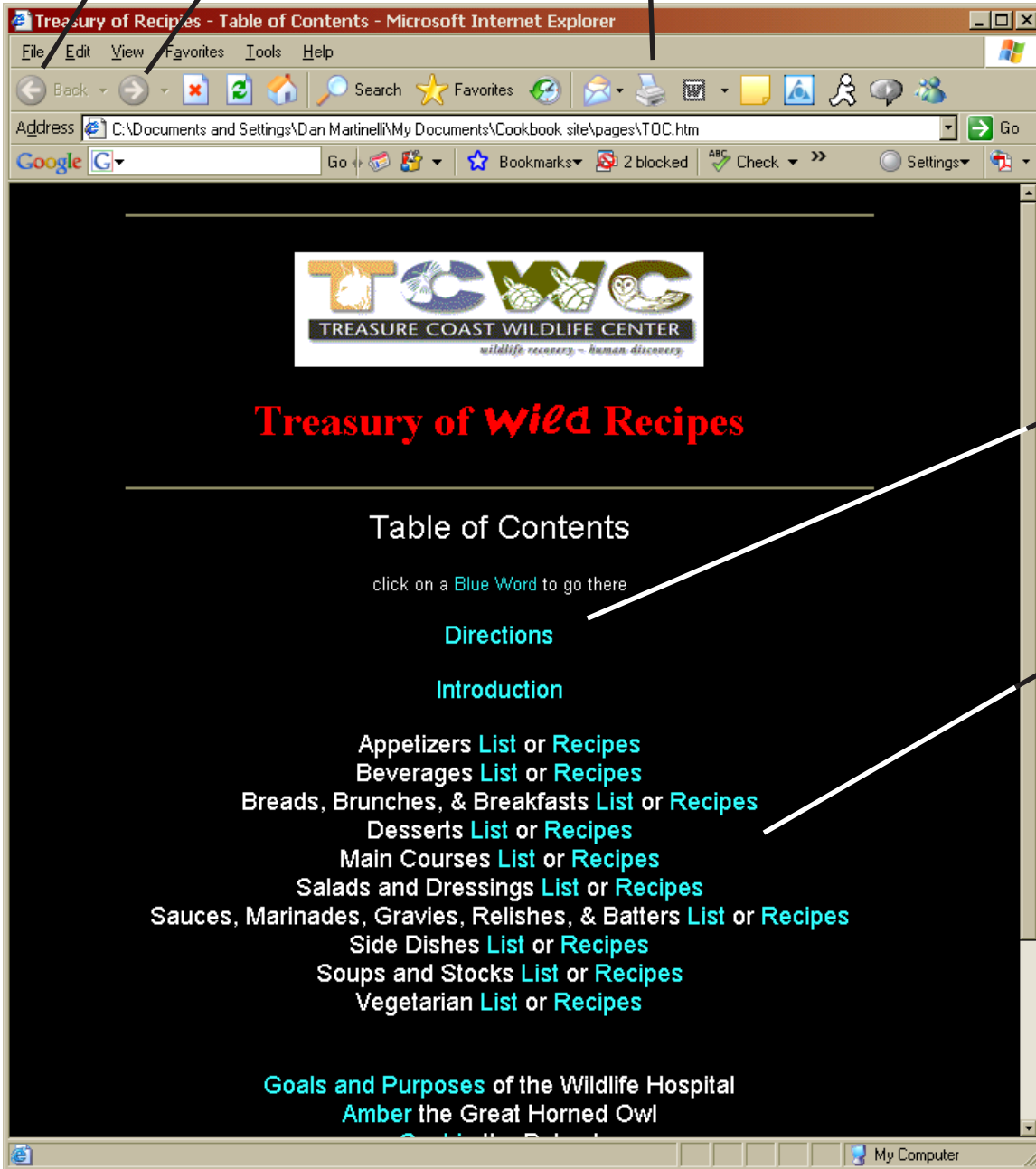


Screen shot - Table of Contents

browser PRINTER button

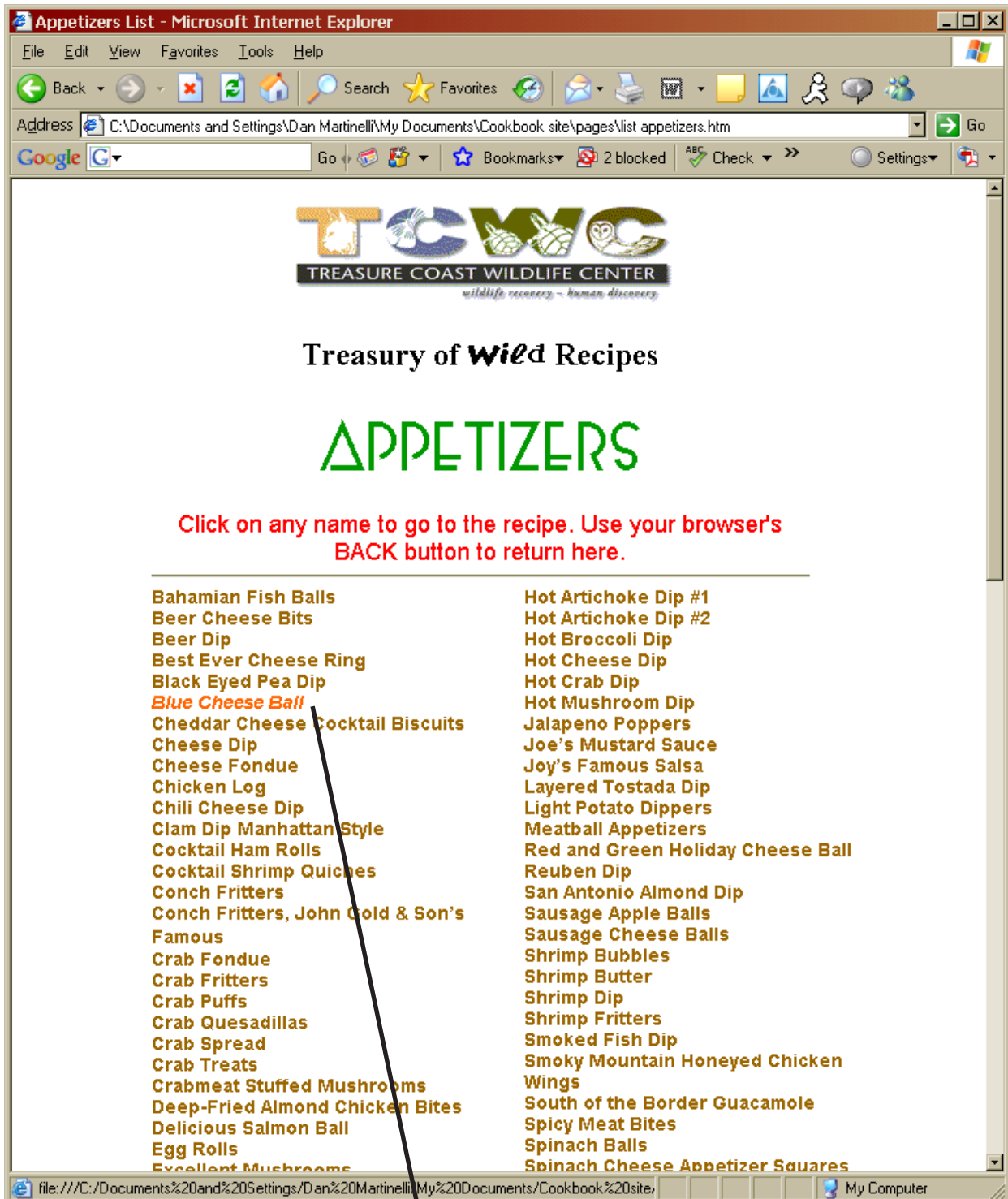
browser SCROLL bar

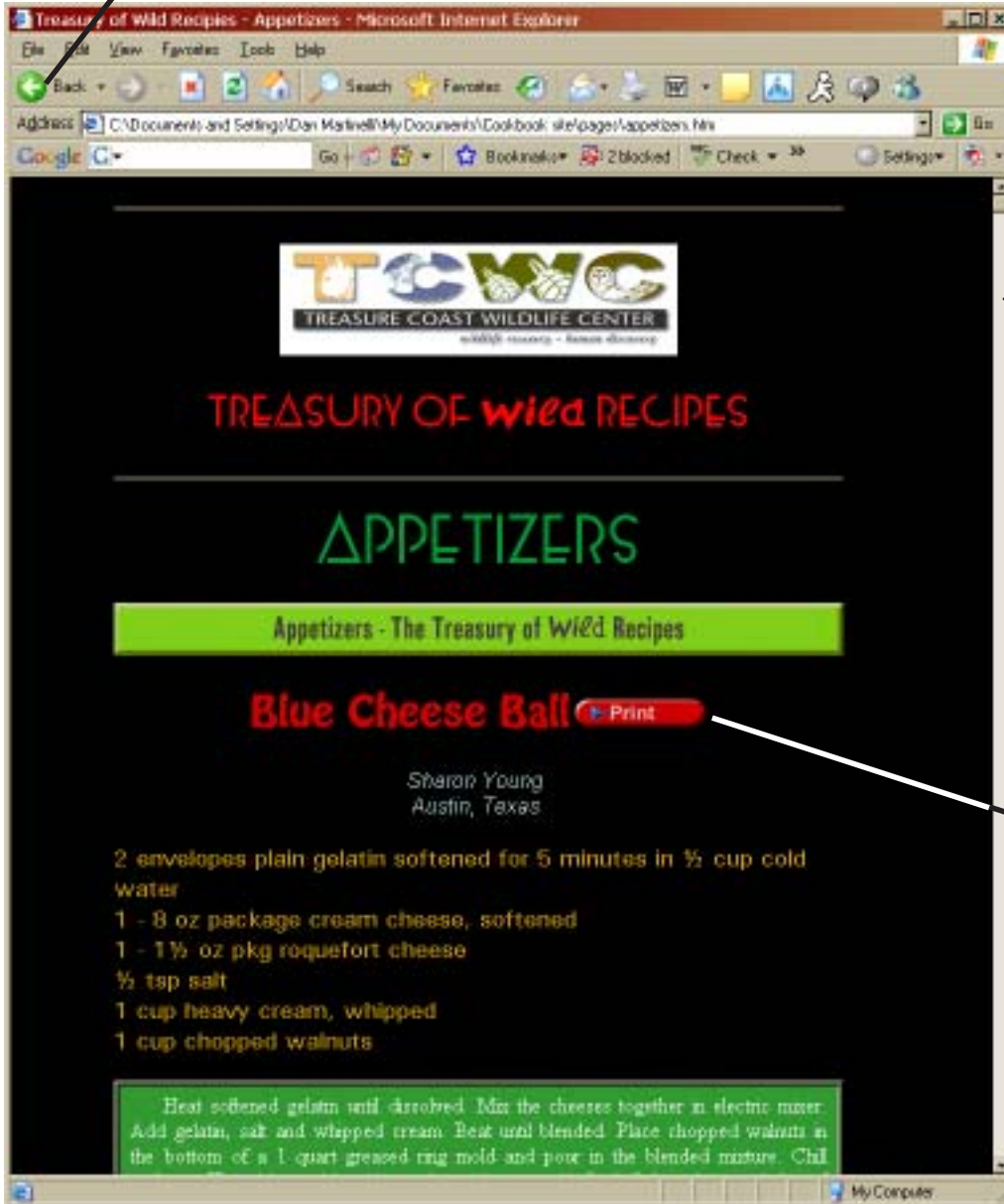
Screen shot - Appetizers List

browser BACK returns you to the previous screen

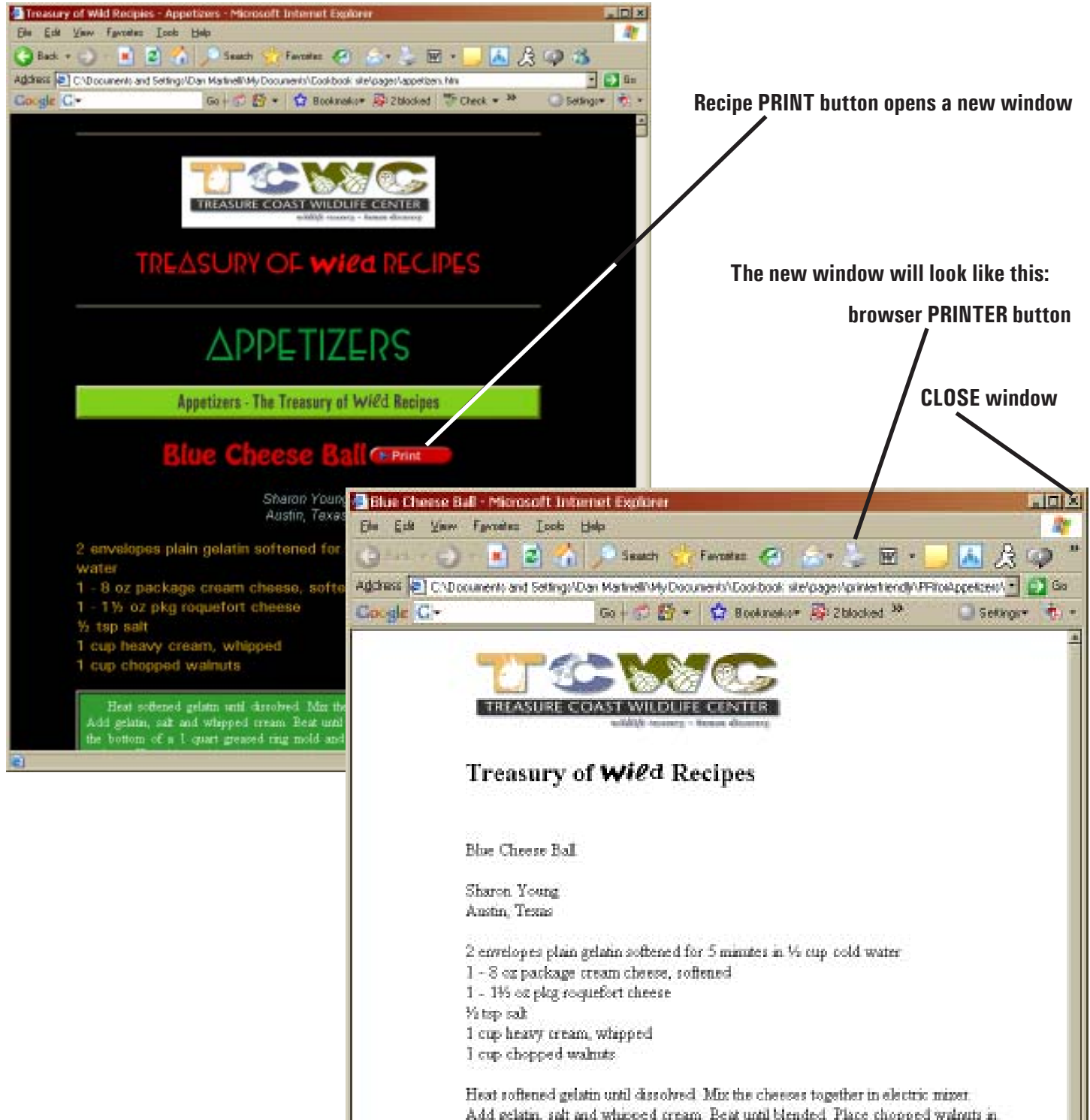


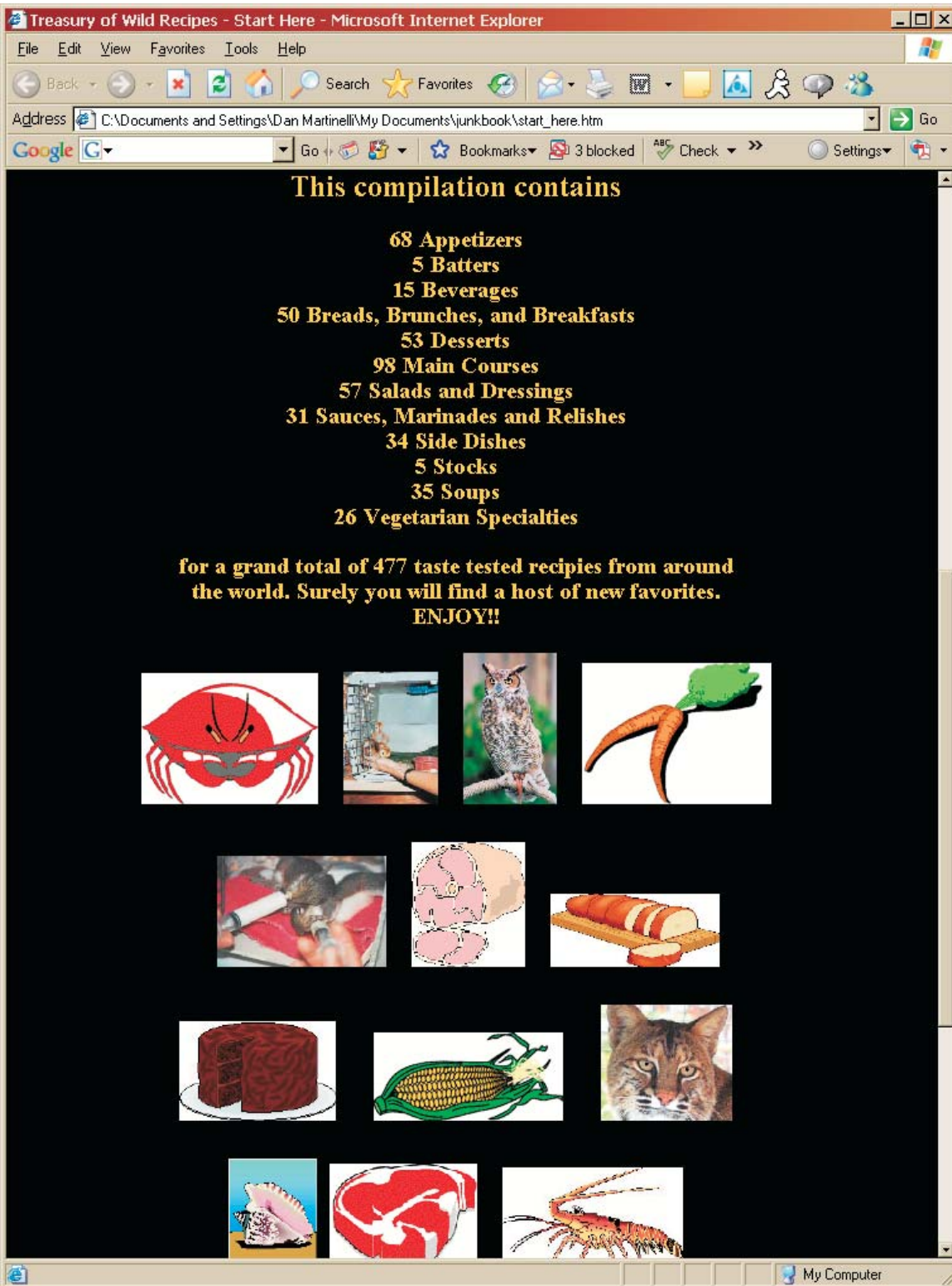
browser scroll bar lets you scroll through recipes OR use Arrow Up and Arrow Down keys and Page Up and Page Down keys

Screen shot - Printer Friendly Window

When you click the PRINT button in a recipe, a new browser window will open on top of the Recipe page. You can click the PRINTER button on this window, or click FILE => PRINT to send this recipe to your attached printer. Then click the CLOSE button or FILE => CLOSE to close this window. The original Recipe window will still be open.
